7. **Complete** the new student orientation online. Go to http://laketech.org/orientation.php and follow the instructions.

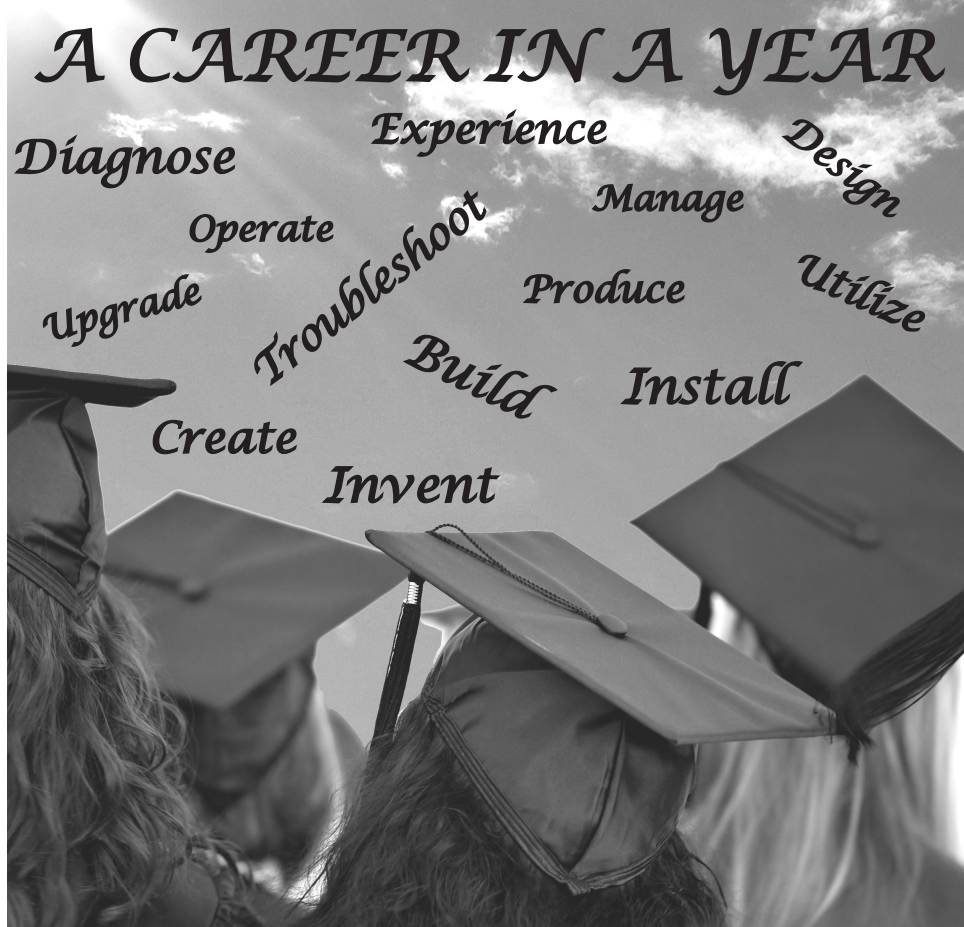
