## **UNITED WAY GIVE RIMES EARLY LEARNING AND LITERACY CENTER \$10,000**

**Leesburg, Florida** – Today, United Way of Lake and Sumter Counties continues to invest in education through a contribution of \$10,000 to Rimes Early Learning and Literacy Center. In 2014-2015 alone, United Way gave \$322,353 to local nonprofits in Lake and Sumter Counties to support their education programs.

"This will enable the student to increase their reading speed and comprehension."

Research shows how it also benefits the whole community: high school graduates have higher earning potential, contribute more to their local economies, are more engaged in their communities, and are more likely to raise kids who also graduate, and go on to higher education or work.

"Our students feed into Fruitland Park, Beverly Shores and Leesburg Elementary as third graders, and we want to make sure they are ready to slide right into the curriculum," said Stacey Roberts, Ed.D., the school's administrator. "We are getting them ready for 21st century learning. We greatly appreciate the United Way for supporting us in this effort. They are a tremendous partner to Rimes and to the Lake County community."
