- The private security industry has been through some significant changes since 9/11. Studies reveal that 65% of officer errors are attributed to poor or no training for the task that they are asked to perform.
- State mandated minimum standards are lacking many necessary areas of training needed in order to have successful and professional Security Officers.
- **Monetary cost for training** officers may be significant, but a lot less expensive than litigating a lawsuit for negligence.
