

Jeopardy in the Classroom

For those of you who regularly attend my Technology or GUIDE sessions, you know I am always talking about formative assessments in the classroom. Formative assessments refer to methods that teachers use to conduct in-process evaluations of student comprehension. Does everyone “get it”, what do I still need to go over, should I reteach? These activities help identify students or concepts that need more attention in order to master the content.

Some formative assessments that we use are Kahoot, questions check, quizzes, think-pair-share, skills check, discussions, etc. For this Tech Tip, I am sharing a Jeopardy game I found. It was made in PowerPoint and is already set up; all you have to do is change the Q & A.
